The Center for Latin American and Caribbean Studies (CLACS) Undergraduate Fellows Program allows Brown undergraduate students with an interest in Latin America and the Caribbean to explore in-depth opportunities to work in/on the region. Becoming a CLACS Fellow is a great way to engage with other students interested in the region, collectively explore pressing issues facing the region, and receive access to CLACS funding opportunities and mentorship. Now in its third year, this program has been revised and improved in order to further engage and expand students' interests in Latin America and the Caribbean.

Commitments

- 1) Orientation meeting at the start of the academic year
- 2) As a collective group CLACS Fellows will organize one public event/workshop per semester, which will involve monthly planning meetings.
- 3) Each Fellow will provide 3 hours of CLACS service per semester (e.g. blog post for website; conference support; video or photography support)

Benefits

- 1) Preferential consideration for CLACS Undergraduate Research Awards
- 2) Mentorship from identified faculty and/or local community leaders
- 3) Networking opportunities and career advice from the CLACS alumni
- 4) Access to funding (up to \$250) to be used for expenses related to interests in Latin America and the Caribbean such as attending a conference, visiting an archive, or other relevant academic purposes
- 5) End of the semester study breaks
