Research Puzzle

- Why does religious violence vary from place to place?
- Why does the level of violence vary across time?



Research Question

What explains violence against Christians in the Middle East from

1952 to the end of 2011?





Intellectual Context

- Existing literature on religious conflict in the Middle East
 - Essentialism and anti-essentialism
 - No empirically supported explanations for religious conflict
- ▶ Ethnic riot literature
 - Explains outbreak of violence (TIME)
- Institutionalism
 - Explains cross-national variation (SPACE)



The Argument

- This thesis argues that government strategy explains the extent of religious violence in the Middle East.
 - Short-run strategy
 - Changes in policy catalyze outbreaks of violence
 - Explains variation in time
 - Long-run strategy
 - Political institutions
 - Explains cross-national variation



Significance/So What?

- New theoretical model for understanding religious violence
- Security concerns
- ▶ Timeliness
 - Arab Revolutions




Research Design

- Two-axis approach
 - Egypt across time (longitudinal)
 - Large-n dataset
 - Process tracing
 - Egypt vs. Jordan (cross-national comparison)
 - "The method of difference" aka "most similar systems"




Findings I

Findings III

Egypt	Jordan
Unified, consistent government strategy to marginalize Copts	Government strategy to accommodate Christians
Presence of Religious	Absence of Religious
Violence	Violence



Findings IV

- Government strategy in Jordan
 - ▶ Legal institutions → protected status
 - Rhetoric of tolerance
- Factors underlying the strategy of accommodation
 - Historical status
 - Moderate Islamist opposition
 - Personal ties between the monarchy & Christians
 - Management of political opposition

- Islamic militants as reactors
- New theoretical model

Practical

- Comprehensive strategy to eliminate violence
- Future of postrevolution Arab countries



Future Research

- Why do some militant Islamic groups target Copts to express dissidence while others target state officials?
- Geography
