CASE SELECTION

Why Brazil?

- 208 million citizens impacted
- 2nd Brazilian impeachment since Collor de Mello's 1992 impeachment
- Re-established democracy in 1988 after 21 years of dictatorship Why Rousseff's Impeachment?
- Questionable legal basis
- Few predicted this impeachment
- Within context of global decline of democracy

- Congressional Content & Discourse Analysis

- Public Opinion Polling
 - Datafolha Polling of Approval Ratings Across Economic Class
- Comparative Analysis Between Economic Indicators & Approval Ratings
 - GDP Growth (World Bank) & Approval Ratings (Datafolha)



Common Wisdom	My Contribution		
Impeachment = Democracy at work	Sometimes impeachments ≠ democratic at work, especially if one group has disproportionate influence		
Societal dynamics play a limited role in impeachments.	Societal groups and shifting attitudes can be a central and interrelated factor.		
Rousseff's impeachment was the result of a singular force.	A comprehensive & holistic model that examines how different forces were deeply interrelated.

THEORETICAL & PRACTICAL IMPLICATIONS

- Latin America: Disillusionment towards Pink Tide governments
- Impeachment can be destructive for young democracies
- Impeachment by segments of elite ≠ democracy at work
- Consider interrelated forces for better impeachment predictions
 - Understand causes → Determine legitimacy → Develop policy and theory to preserve democracy within global decline
