Request for Applications

The Center for Human Rights and Humanitarian Studies at Brown University's Watson Institute for International and Public Affairs is now accepting applications for human rights and humanitarian research and training seed grants.

CHRHS Research and Training Seed Grants are designed to help fund innovation-driven approaches to increasing the effectiveness and accountability of disaster preparedness, humanitarian response, and post-emergency reconstruction as well as furthering a deeper understanding of global human rights. Preference will be given to proposals that demonstrate interdisciplinary collaboration between Brown students/faculty/fellows and local academics and practitioners at the site of the research or training program. We especially encourage collaborations with our Affiliated Faculty, Affiliated Fellows, and/or Global Fellows.

CHRHS Training Seed Grants

Amount: **Up to \$1,000**

Proposals for Training Seed Grants may include support for the development of new curriculum, workshops, seminars, simulation-based learning, or conferences either within existing institutions or as a kick-starter for independent initiatives.

Application Requirements:

- 1) Name, affiliation, & contact info of all applicants
- 2) Abstract of proposed training activity (title, brief summary, projected date/s)
- 3) Total amount requested
- 4) Full description of proposed training activity (rationale, scope, collaborations, expected outcomes)
- 5) Detailed budget (please include other sources of received or anticipated funding)
- 6) Timeline for proposed training activity (preference will be given to activities occurring before June 2019)
- 7) Attached CV

Amount: **Up to \$3,000**

Research Seed Grants are designed to stimulate original research that addresses topics of human rights, disaster preparedness, humanitarian response, and/or post emergency reconstruction. Support may be given to groups launching a new research project or towards evolving the scale of an existing project.

Application Requirements:

- 1) Name, affiliation, & contact info of all applicants
- 2) Summary of proposed research (no more than 300 words)
- 3) Total amount requested
- 4) Full description of proposed research protocol (rationale, goals and objectives, study design, methodology, collaborations, expected outcomes, ethical considerations)
- 5) Detailed budget (please include other sources of received or anticipated funding)
- 6) Timeline for proposed research (preference will be given to research conducted within a year of receiving funding)
- 7) Attached CV
