Key responsibilities:

- Prepare, for use on Crisis Group's website, short summaries of Crisis Group's approach
 to and engagement with the various conflicts it covers, as well as of the conflicts
 themselves;
- Contribute to research and writing projects on other topics as necessary.

The position offers an excellent opportunity to gain valuable experience in a high profile international NGO and to learn about the variety conflict.

Requirements:

- Current Brown undergraduate, or Brown alumnus/a having earned an undergraduate degree in 2016 or 2017, majoring in international relations or a similar subject;
- Excellent verbal and written command of English (other language proficiency a plus);
- Familiarity with Crisis Group reports highly recommended;
- Good research and note taking skills;
- Computer skills in Microsoft Office, email and internet applications;
- Good organisational skills, self-motivation and flexible;
- Must be available 40 hours per week for a period of 3 months;
- Authorization to work in the United States.
