7. Initial Thesis Prospectus

Under a separate cover please write an initial thesis prospectus of 1000-1500 words. This prospectus should include:

1. Tentative Thesis Title
2. Description of how you became interested in the policy area you have chosen and why it is important to you.
3. Specification of the most important question or questions you hope your thesis will help to answer or better understand (e.g. What policy question are you hoping to help answer, or what policy outcome are you hoping to help explain?)

4. Discussion of why these policy questions or outcomes are important, and to the best of your current knowledge what the existing literature on the subject says about them.
5. Description of the methods (research design) you expect to use to investigate your topic and to answer the questions you have defined. If you expect your research design to depend heavily on quantitative analysis describe what you know about the availability of the requisite data sets. If you expect your research design will depend heavily on qualitative methods describe the type of fieldwork you expect to do, and when you expect to do it.
6. A discussion of your current suppositions (hypotheses) about the forces, factors, or processes that best answer the policy question or questions you are asking or the outcomes you are hoping to explain.
7. Please submit a writing sample (ex, a seminar paper) that illustrates your best analytic work.
